Since the June 12th meeting, there have been a few people who indicated they would like to volunteer to patrol the neighborhoods. We're excited to have new members and are looking for more volunteers, so that we can provide this service for as many hours a day as possible. ## IN MEMORIAM

IRMGARD RENKWITZ FENGER

July 10, 1929 – June 19, 2019

Irmgard "Daisy" Fenger, 89, from Mesa, Arizona, passed away on June 19, 2019. She was born on July 10, 1929 in Saughwethen, Germany (formerly East Prussia) and enjoyed a rural childhood in eastern Germany until the start of World War II, at which time she and her family were forced to flee from their home. They eventually restarted their lives in Schlesien, which is Poland today.

After marriage, Irmgard and her husband, Willy, moved to the United States in the 1960s, where they settled in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, with their two sons, Jeffry and Claus. Irmgard moved to Mesa in the 1980s, where she loved the climate, her garden and swimming in her Dreamland community. Irmgard was fiercely independent and a wonderful storyteller.

Irmgard is survived by her grandson, Jon Greiner, and preceded in death by her husband and sons.

No services will be held according to her wishes.

the help that this service has offered and will continue to offer to both Dreamland Villa and to the Velda Rose Estates folks.

There's a never-ending supply of folks thanking us for being here for them. The good stories about Help Services are endless, but still at the same time we can't find any new folks to step up to the plate and help us out, why is that? I know for a fact that our President Patty Thorpe has been out trying to recruit new Monitors plus maybe even new board members. Take for instance, Joanna Padilla. She has been beating the bushes trying to find help in Dreamland Villa and Velda Rose Estates. The other monitors are also helping to find good folks to help out.

Help Services is already down to only three days a week in the summer months, due to the lack of monitors. If this trend continues, what's the next step folks?

When you think of the true meaning of Help Services it is exactly what it says. We help in the way of a total commitment to provide the best medical devices and large selection of medical equipment anywhere at no charge and all for a small donation if people wish to offer, such as portable roll away beds, folding chairs, toys for the grandchildren, baby beds, high chairs, booster seats, playpens and more. Our biggest attributes are our many medical items such as bath tub whirlpool, bed pans, body lift, commodes, toilet risers (with and without handrails), knee-walkers that fold, canes of all different kinds (some quads, some folding, etc.), crutches, C-walkers, wheeled walkers wheel-chairs, just to mention a few. All of which I might add are completely gone through by our full time technician who works very hard on making sure the equipment is sanitized and brought up to medical technical equipment standards.

Please remember, Help Services is financed solely by your donations and, as always, tax deductible. Our normal hours for the summer months is as follows, Monday 9:00 am to noon, Wednesday, 9 to noon, Friday 9 to noon, closed on Saturdays. 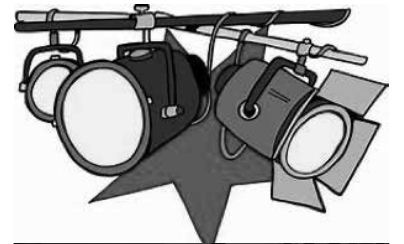

The November/December classes will only be six weeks and will be \$30. To participate in the classes you must be a DVRC dues paid member.

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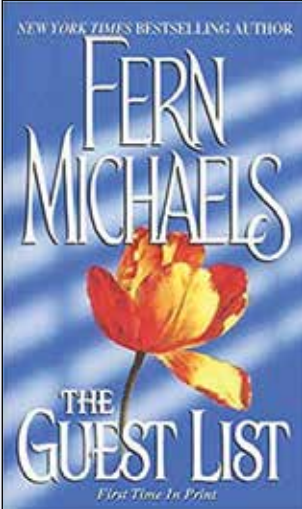

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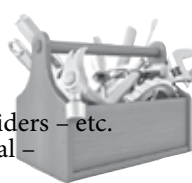
