CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

All, please know that Dreamland Villa Retirement Community is adhering to the recommendations of our State and County Health departments and those of the Center for Disease Control (CDC). When there is more information, we will share it.

In the meantime, we ask that each of you take steps to protect yourself and those close to you. You can help stop COVID-19 by knowing the signs and symptoms:

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath

Seek medical advice if you develop symptoms or have been in close contact with a person known to have COVID-19 or have recently traveled from an area with ongoing spread of

COVID-19. The CDC recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Facemasks should be used by people who show symptoms of COVID-19 to help prevent the spread of the disease to others.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

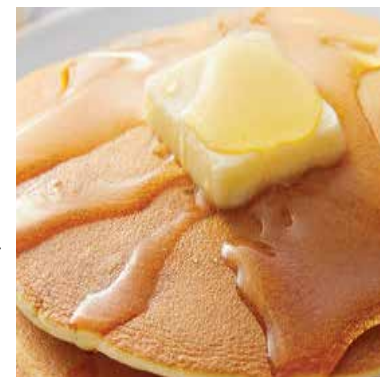
Please know that DVRC is concerned and we hope that you will stay healthy during this difficult time. We have closed our facilities until further notice.

New Compliance Committee for 2020

Dreamland Villa Retirement Community has always had a compliance committee that worked to address complaints that residents have within our community. This committee has been more active and effective at times than others. Most recently Bruce Gile had been single-handedly trying to resolve conflicts or problems, until he became physically unable to do so. We are so grateful for Bruce's dedication to this cause! For over a month, we have formed a new committee of six people who have agreed to work on these issues. It is the goal of this Compliance Committee to help resolve situations that have come up which make it difficult to enjoy life here in Dreamland. Because as a Senior Community, don't we all just want to enjoy life?! If you have filed a complaint with the DVRC office, your complaint is on our radar and if we haven't already, we will be getting in touch with you!

In last month's Citizen, there was an article about RV's in driveways and front yards of homes. We want to start our monthly articles with that issue and will address various other complaints that come up in upcoming articles.

As was previously discussed, Dreamland's "rules" are really those of Maricopa County. MC ordinance 1114 is the ordinance addressing mobile homes, campers, RV's, etc. Some of its highlights state: 1114.1 "At no time shall the mobile home, travel trailer, aircraft, boat, camping trailer, truck camper or motor home be occupied or used for living, sleeping or housekeeping purposes..." 1114.1.2 "If a travel trailer, aircraft, boat, camping trailer, truck camper or motor home is located or stored outside of a garage or carport, it shall be placed in the rear yard of the lot or side yard of the lot, but not within the required front yard [Single Family Residential Zoning states

that each residence must have a front yard of not less than 20 feet deep] except for loading and unloading purposes may be permitted for a period of time not to exceed 72 hours. Such storage shall maintain a 5-foot clear path around any structures."

So, all of that "legaleze" means that your camper, trailer, boat, RV needs to be stored in the back yard, or in the side yard, but cannot stick out past the front of the house. And there must be at least 5-feet all the way around it. So, if your neighbors are complaining about your trailer in the driveway or front yard, they have a legitimate complaint. It can be hazardous for backing out onto the street. And really, who wants to look at a camper instead of the beauty that surrounds us here in the valley?! Our committee thanks you in advance for coming into compliance with the Maricopa County Ordinances. We hope you're enjoying spring in Mesa!

Board of Directors Meeting

Pledge of Allegiance
Welcome: Johna Sharp, President
Call to Order: 6:30 pm by Johna Sharp, President
Roll Call: Kathie Chismar, Secretary. Present were Kathie Wissinger, Larry Thoma, Earl Munday, Johna Sharp, Dan Hampton, Aggie Forsyth and Kathie Chismar. A quorum was present.

Ratification of Minutes: Earl made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 12, 2020 Board Meeting and the March 4, 2020 Study Session Meeting Minutes. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

February, 2020 Treasurer's Report: Dan Hampton. The full report is posted on the bulletin board outside the office. Members may request a copy of the report from the office.

Administrative Services Report: Jack Babb, Administrative Services Manager. Jack reported we have 1658 members as of the end of February, including 26 residents that paid the Initial Membership Fee. A copy of his report is available in the office.

Standing Committee Reports: Copies of reports, if available, are on file in the office.

Old Business: None
New Business:
Committee Chair Appointments: With the advice and consent of the Board, the President appointed Kristine Burling as Compliance Committee Chair. The appointment was approved unanimously.

With the advice and consent of the Board, the President appointed Christine Mortimer as Neighborhood Watch Chair. The appointment was approved unanimously.

Policies and Procedures: Earl made a motion to amend the Rules and Regulations to delete the early closing hours for Farnsworth Pools and to add language to not allow animals into any pool water. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Study Session Format Change: Earl made a motion that the Study Session meeting format be changed so that it is less formal, and so that the meeting minutes no longer need to be published. The motion was seconded. Discussion: The changes will eliminate the Call to Order, Pledge and roll call. Topics for discussion need to be submitted to the Secretary

10 days prior to the meeting to be added to the agenda. Notes from the session will be available to members in the office, but formal minutes will not be published. The motion was passed unanimously.

Farnsworth Hall Sound System: The Entertainment Committee has obtained two bids for an upgraded sound system. They are requesting a third bid.

Library: Librarian Donna Hopp announced her decision to retire in February, effective May 1. No one has come forward to replace her and use of the library has fallen off. Donna has recommended closing the library. Earl made a motion that the library be closed effective April 1, 2020, and that Librarian Donna Hopp be authorized to sell any books remaining at that time. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. Aggie will choose books from the Library for the book exchange in the multipurpose rooms. Some book shelves may be brought from the library to the multipurpose room.

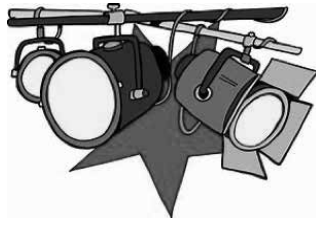

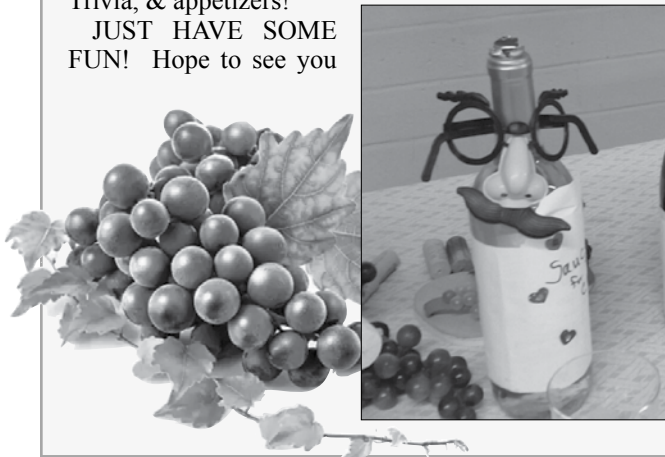

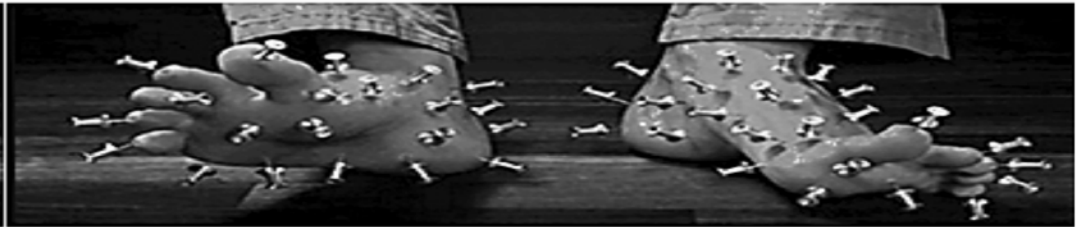
