Even though our facilities have been closed, the internal work has continued. Office employees have been working remotely and maintenance staff have been on the grounds working

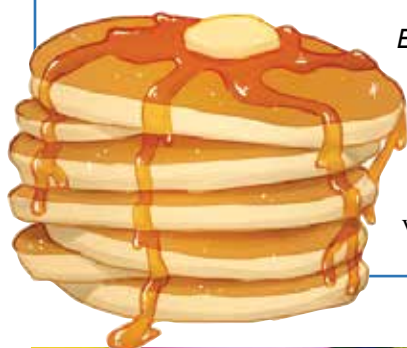

## Compliance Committee Updates

This month the Compliance Committee would like to address some animal control issues that are prevalent in Dreamland Villa. The two most common complaints that residents are bringing to our attention are:

- Dogs not controlled by the owner
- Feeding birds and other feral animals

1. Maricopa County Code P-13 addresses Rabies and Animal Control. This Ordinance speaks to any and all animals kept by residents, but especially dogs.

Section 3 a. Each dog 4 months of age or over must be licensed and the tag given at time of licensing must be attached to a collar on the dog at all times.

Section 5 a. Before licensing, a dog owner must present a certificate that the dog has been vaccinated for Rabies and no dog will be licensed if a certificate is not presented.

Section 7 a. No dog shall be permitted at large. Each dog shall be confined within an enclosure on the owner's property or secured on a leash that is no more than 6-feet in length and directly under the owner's control.

Section 7 c. If any dog is at large on the public streets, parks or public property, the dog's owner is in violation of the ordinance.

For Leash Law Violations you may call the number in the bullet point below or fill out a complaint online at: <https://esd.maricopa.gov/FormCenter/Animal-Care-Control-4/Leash-Law-Violation-124>.

Ordinance P-6 also addresses excessive barking, which is in violation of Maricopa County ordinances. Call Animal Control at

602-506-7387.

We have had multiple reports of people and/or their dogs being attacked by dogs which were not secured within some sort of enclosure or on a leash not more than 6 feet in length and under full control of the owner or attendant. When this happens, the dog owner is in violation and risks having their animal picked up by Animal Control! Please be a good neighbor and control your pets!

2. We have also received many complaints about people feeding pigeons and other birds. The City of Mesa has an ordinance preventing the feeding of pigeons. Maricopa County, however, does not at this time have such an ordinance. They DO, however, have an Environmental Health Code, Chapter 3, which discusses anything that could cause a public health nuisance. Pigeon droppings may be considered such a health code violation. This link is to an article by Terminix which is quite informative and among other things, says there are 60+ diseases that can stem from pigeon droppings.

If your neighbors are asking you not to feed the birds, they have valid concerns. Please be a good neighbor and don't feed the birds! There is plenty available for them to eat in nature without our help.

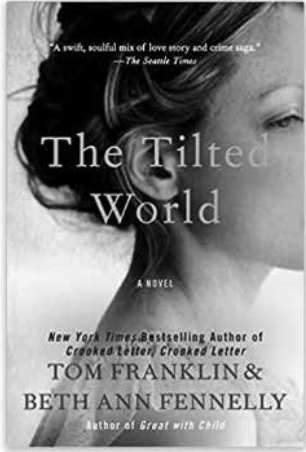

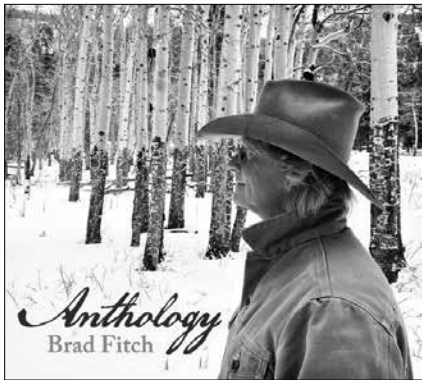

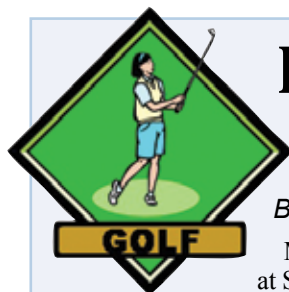
