ARIZONA DAY TRIPS:

Musical instrument Museum

"Music is the language of the Soul"

Would you know what a pipa is; what a frog scraper is? Where would you find an Ud, a Shegbureh, a Kangoma, or a Jabawai in the same building? Even heard of them? Well, neither had I. But there is a place to see and hear them. The Musical Instrument Museum (MIM) that's where. Here you will find over 10,000 musical instruments from all over the world in one location.



What a fascinating place! It is amazing how many different, interesting musical instruments there are in the world. No matter what country, what color, creed, religion there is, people all over seem to find a way to make music. No wonder music is the language of the soul.

The museum is really an all-day trip just in itself, or two. Divided by regions of the world there are 12-plus rooms full of instruments. Instruments from Africa, Middle East, Central and South Asia Southeast Asia Oceania America, Europe, the United States and Canada are on display. There are a large variety of drums, lutes, flutes, guitars, and more. The people in these various countries used what was available to them from their environment and lands to create a variety of sounds to celebrate events, accompany rituals or just plain entertainment. It was amazing to think of how many variations of the same type of instrument were created by different people. As the brochure says, "Travel the world of music in MIM's five geographical galleries. State-of-the-art audio and video recordings allow you to hear and see the creative spirit of people from every country in the world as they play their instruments. Attend a traditional Beijing opera. Celebrate a contemporary Ukrainian wedding. Pulse to the rhythm of Nigerian drums. And let the good times roll with Cajun zydeco."

When you come into the museum, after you pay your \$13 (for seniors) fee, you are given ear phones so you can actually hear samples of the music from each country. Start out with the orientation video in the Orientation Gallery behind the guest services desk and then move on to the various rooms to view their displays. We started upstairs first touring the Africa, Middle East and all the Asian rooms. Then we moved on the Oceania and Latin American rooms. By this time I was pooped. Within these rooms, each country had typical musical instruments and in some areas costumes and masks were on display. Videos in each area also gave you

a taste of the people who played them and danced to their native music

By the time we had finished these rooms we had walked ourselves OUT. Too tired to go further we missed the United States/Canada room and Europe room. We also missed the downstairs displays. While we went in on one afternoon, it is an all-day event if you started out when they open and stayed until they closed. You might see it all in that case (maybe). For us, we will go back another day to catch what we missed. It's well worth it.

The museum also has a café, a gift shop, and a room for experiencing various musical instruments, as well as the Mechanical Music Gallery and Artist Gallery. In the Artist Gallery the piano that John Lennon used to compose the song, "Imagine," is on display. There is also a Music Theatre with a full schedule of concerts throughout the year. The Target Gallery hosts special and traveling exhibits. The Conservation Lab provides an opportunity to see instruments being restored and preserved. If you like to volunteer, the museum has a program and is a great way to get involved.

It is considered the most extraordinary museum you will ever hear. Even Tony Bennett said, "MIM is my favorite museum in the world. Everyone needs to see it."

The museum is located on the southwest corner of Tatum Blvd and Mayo Blvd. Head up the I-101 north, exit on Tatum to the south and it's just a short distance from the freeway. There's plenty of parking and a short walk to the entrance.

That's it for this month... I'd highly recommend a visit to this museum if you have never been there. Next month we will see you someplace else in Arizona. Welcome back neighbors.

President's Message

Hello everyone and welcome to August. I hope everyone is handling the heat well. I would like to thank all of those that were involved in the Brats and Beans event that was held on the 4th of July. The event was for the most part a rousing success, except for the fact that way more of you showed up at the door hoping to get in then was planned for. Last year the attendance was about 65 people. This year more food was bought, hoping for a larger turn-out. By twenty minutes after the doors opened, 100 folks were enjoying themselves, and the food had run out. 100 of you came out for a Summer event and that is awesome! We average 120-130 for pancake breakfasts during the winter season when all the winter residents are here. I knew there were many more hardy folks who lived here year-round. To those who were turned away, as the President I wish to say I am so sorry. If the event gets held again next year, we will have to hold it at Farnsworth Hall in order to accommodate the crowds. Thank you to all who did come and got in, it was a great event.

Not much to report business-wise this month. The board got together for lunch, to discuss the financial future of DVRC, and what we need to have ready to go when we reconvene in October at our first study session of the season. I know I am just preaching to the choir here, but we are in dire straits. As of July 15th, we have a total of 1,749 kee card holders. We have barely enough on-hand funds to get us through the rest of 2017. For 2018, we are going to need closer to 2,300 folks to pay the requested annual fees. If that does NOT happen, your board is going to have to decide what gets cut. What if any DVRC properties have to be sold? What amenities get eliminated? Do we just keep the office open so we can maintain the records required by HUD that are needed to keep us a 55+ community, or since roughly 55 percent do not seem to support us being a 55+ community since they, for whatever reason, refuse to pay their requested annual fees Do we

just let the 55+ designation expire and we become just another multi-generational community? This is the sad truth of where we are today, this is not an aww shucks, we really just want more money. This is not a scare tactic. We simply cannot continue to operate with only 45 percent of you paying your requested fees. YES, the board is going to look at many ways to make things not only more fair, but in finding ways to get more of you to pay. I ask all of you recent home buyers, WHY did you buy here? If being a 55+ community was one of those reasons, then you simply MUST look at the \$175 a year as a part of home ownership in a 55+ community. If you bought here because of the activities, but are still working and waiting to pay once you do retire, those things won't be here then. Yes, I know that there are many of you long-time residents who are getting by on bare minimum, fixed incomes, that just cannot afford them. But there are more than enough who can but choose not to. 2,300 annual fee payers is what we have to have. We have over 4,000 residents, so this goal is very attainable, but you can no longer rely on your neighbors to pay and you not pay.

On another note, I received a letter from someone. I do not know who it was that sent it to me, as there is no name or address on the envelope. They included a few articles culled from the monthly Citizen newspaper, with comments hand written on them. I wish whoever sent this to me hadn't hid behind a cloak of anonymity. This person has some concerns that we cannot even begin to address without know what part of the Villa you live in and which neighbor you feel is running a Grandma's day camp as you called it. If you are a kee card holder, the office will be more than happy to help you fill out a complaint form. However, if you are not a kee card holder, then you need to file your complaint directly with the County of Maricopa.

Hope you all have a nice August, and hope to see you around the Villa!




