Its Official!! Dreamland Villa Retirement Community

On January 20, 2017 the Arizona Corporation Commission approved the restated Articles of Incorporation authorizing the former club to be renamed Dreamland Villa Retirement Community, file no. 0058072-7.

The residents of the Dreamland Villa Community, who also provide the financial support to keep the corporation financially solvent, showed up in one of the largest membership turn-outs, voting 563 in favor of the name change. Only eight voted against the forward thinking re-branding concept.

The Directors and Dreamland Villa Retirement Community Office staff have been busy communicating this new message to the real estate professionals, their associations, the title companies' escrow agents and Dreamland Villa's new home buyers.

A 1980 Maricopa County Zoning Ordinance designated Dreamland Villa as a 55+ age-restricted Subdivision and requires Dreamland Villa Retirement Community to comply with the legal requirements set forth in the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, Housing for Older Persons Act of 1995. Dreamland Villa must comply with paragraph 100.305 (a) of the Act and be able to document that at least 80% of the dwelling units are occupied by at least one person 55 years of age or older. Paragraph 100.307 (c) of the Act also requires regular updates of the documentation, through surveys or affidavits, at least

one every two years.

The purpose of re-branding the "club" to the Dreamland Villa Retirement Community: inform realtors, escrow agents and new residents that for Dreamland Villa to remain a 55+ age-restricted Subdivision, it is absolutely essential that the Read Hall office and staff exist to comply with the regulatory requirements.

The new residents' one-time transfer fee paid at the close of escrow and the recurring annual fees are intended to cover the costs of processing the new residents' paperwork, the required verification of occupancy surveys or affidavits and maintaining the retirement community.

Protect Dreamland Villa's Senior Overlay

Senior communities are plentiful in Mesa – for good reason. Not only is our lovely city the second home to many active retirees, but there are tax and lifestyle advantages to residents in a registered "55+ Community."

Those of us with kids and grandkids love them, but many of us chose Dreamland Villa to avoid the ruckus of living in

a family neighborhood. Here, there are no kids doing wheelies on bikes in the middle of the street, no rough-housing on front lawns and no yelping and hollering – unless you're in Farnsworth Hall during Country Jam.

Remaining a protected, 55+ community means every resident in Dreamland Villa must update their information every two years. Fortunately, our efficient Dreamland Villa office staff will contact you if your information must be updated.

When they reach out to you, they are not trying to bother you – they are working to protect your community. If you hear from a staff member, please cooperate with them and provide them with the information they need.

To learn more about Dreamland Villa's senior overlay, take a look at Pat Clark's President's Message. He goes into more detail about the change in our community's designation at the state level and the effort of keeping our overlay up-to-date.

Dreamland Villa Memory Bricks



Dreamland Villa Retirement Community Board of Directors February 7, 2017, Approved Study Session Minutes

Welcome: Pat Clark, President.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Call to Order: 9 a.m.
Roll Call: Ward Jennings, Secretary.

Present: Pat Clark, Bruce Gile, Ward Jennings, John

Pawloski, Sr. and Janet Peterson.

Treasurer's Report: Ward Jennings, Treasurer. The January 31, 2017 Balance Sheet, Statements of Revenue and Expense, Capital Expenditures, and Restricted Funds and the Treasurer's Report were presented. The 2017 Annual Fees were slightly higher compared to the same period last year. The combined cash balances were \$35,411 greater than the same period in 2016.

Old Business: None

New Business:

2016 Audit Report Presentation: Nancy Schnoor, Audit Committee Chairperson, addressed the management letter's recommendations. The Audit Committee Report for the year ending December 31, 2016 Audit and the Management Letter are available in the Read Hall business office.

Administrative Services Manager Job Description: Ward Jennings commented that the job description was last updated in 2009 and should be revised to include the administration of the property management system data, the new WINPAC key card system, and incorporate the abolished bookkeeper position's responsibilities. Syd Clark, Personnel Committee Chairperson

stated the Personnel Committee is working with the Policy Committee on this and other Personnel policies.

Committee Chairpersons Resignation:

Policy Committee Chairperson: Ann Krasselt has resigned as Chairperson. President Clark has nominated Char Grande as the new Chairperson. The Directors acknowledged they would provide their advice and consent at the February 14, 2017 Board Meeting for this appointment.

Farnsworth Hall Rental Chairperson: Bruce Gile stated that he intends to resign as Chairperson at the end of April 2017. No replacement of the Chairperson was discussed. However, the Personnel Committee stated they are working with the Policy Committee to possibly hire a full time event manager to be the Farnworth Hall Rental Sales Coordinator.

Administrative Policy and Procedure, Section: Accounting. Ward Jennings provided a revision to the Accounting Policy stating that any item purchased costing \$1,000 or more and having a useful life greater than one year, regardless of the source of funds to pay for the purchase, shall be capitalized-not expensed. The policy change shall be submitted to a Director vote at the February 14, 2017 Board of Directors Meeting.

Property Management System: Ward Jennings discussed a revised 55+ age restricted compliance computer generated report and compared its results to a similar report generated December 5, 2016. Both reports indicate that a significant number of rental property owners are not providing affidavits

for the occupants of their rental property. The current computer system does not provide for a systematic approach to identify properties that need updated affidavits and also export an EXCEL file to be used with mail-merge to address this issue. The Directors are seeking a solution to the problem.

ARMLS Dreamland Villa Real Estate Listings: Ward Jennings provided examples of current real estate agent listings that continue to state "Voluntary HOA if you wish to use the pool & clubhouse facilities" or similar wording and fail to identify Dreamland Villa as being a 55+ age-restricted Subdivision. Similar disclosure issues are prevalent in approximately 40 current MLS listing of Dreamland Villa Subdivision properties. See the next paragraph, Re-Branding Status.

Re-Branding Status: Ward Jennings stated that a targeted mailing of a "Press Release or Announcement" to real estate professionals and the title companies of the name change and required disclosure corrections should be completed by February 17, 2017. Other actions are being taken to create a new website for the Dreamland Villa Retirement Community to better market Farnsworth Hall as a rental venue, promote real estate agents who are ambassadors for our Community, provide vendors who provide services to maintain our homes, lifestyles and well-being as well as the current community activities and information.

On January 19, Joe Hoover's android class explored the KeePass


