To begin with, we would like to thank everyone that participated in our annual fund drive. With your help we were able to equal and surpass our last's year total. It's very heartening to see how the residents of Dreamland Villa appreciate our efforts.

I've been asked what we're looking for when we do a slow roll past your house on patrol. In short, we are looking for anything out of the ordinary. As we are the eyes and ears of the MCSO, and we maintain direct contact with the dispatch center, we're looking to do what we can, to not only be a presence, but to report what we see and are trained to be "good witnesses". Everyone in our Posse is trained and certified in Basic First Aid and CPR so we are looking for our residents that may have had an accident, fall, or sudden illness. We're looking for doors and windows that may have been broken into, and even pets that may have gone "walkabout" and need to be pointed in the right direction to get home.

Just a few asides: Stop signs and speed limit signs are NOT a suggestion. They are the law and a complete stop is required before proceeding through the intersection. Also, yard sales are very exciting to many people, but please don't forget what we learned before taking our driver's test. No parking on a corner, so that other people coming to the stop sign can see clearly in both directions before pulling out. No parking on sidewalks even if you think you'll only be a couple of minutes. Find a parking spot near the curb. (Believe it or not, I've seen people stop their cars in the middle of the street). I know you're anxious to get to the next sale, but please look both ways before crossing the street and pulling away from the curb. Getting a ticket, (and/or) a crunched-up car, can negate very quickly what deals you may have just gotten.

As many of our friends and neighbors are either gone, or preparing to leave, for parts in the North Country, we want to wish them a happy and safe summer and look forward to seeing them in the fall. As this is also our busiest time of year, I will be suspending the "Posse Corner" until October. Syblann "Syb" Gullickson Friends are remembering Syblann "Syb" Gullickson as a longtime resident of Dreamland Villa who devoted her time to volunteering to improve the community.

Gullickson, 88, died April 15 at Banner Baywood Heart Hospital after a short illness.

Syb Smith was born in Bottineau, N.D., on Dec. 9, 1929. The family lived in Bismarck, Minot and Casselton before settling in Grand Forks, where she graduated from high school. She graduated from St. Cloud, Minn., State Teachers College in 1952.

She married Will Gullickson on June 3, 1951, and they lived in Troy, Ala., and Willmar, Minn., before moving to Fargo, N.D., and then Moorhead, Minn. He died in 1990.

Gullickson started work

She spent summers at Lake Washington, near Mankato, Minn.

She is survived by three sons, Glenn of Phoenix, Roger "Rock" of St. Charles, Mo., and Tedd of Burnsville, Minn.; one brother, Dickinson Smith of Bainbridge Island, Wash.; two grandsons, Dan of Omaha, Neb.,

Born Dec. 16, 1923 in Ida-

ho, he relocated to Arizona in 1988 following his retirement. He worked as a businessman in Moscow, Idaho, managing two jewelry stores and later working with his wife at Snip~N~Whip Fabrics, doing sewing machine repair. After his retirement, he and Anna spent six summers working for the National Park Service in Wyoming and Colorado. They also enjoyed traveling to Alaska and visiting family in several states.

Survivors include his wife, Anna (Lawson), whom he married on June 30, 1944; children, Caroline (Dan) Nelson of Mesa, Nancy (Steve) Koorenny of Tacoma, Wash., Charles "Larry" (Christine) Krasselt of Moscow, Idaho, and Timothy (Roger Di Paolo) Krasselt of Stow, Ohio; 10 grandchildren; 24 great-grandchildren and 10 great-great grandchildren. A granddaughter, Tammy Mundell, four brothers and a sister died previously.

His wish was for his body to be donated to Research for Life, followed by cremation, with his ashes scattered over the desert in Arizona.

Welcome: Johna Sharp, President **Pledge of Allegiance**

Call to Order: 6:30 p.m. by Johna Sharp, President

Roll Call: Kathie Chismar. Secretary. Present were Johna Sharp, Earl Munday, Mary Newkirk, Larry Thoma, Kathleen Wissinger, Lynn Campbell, and Kathie Chismar. A quorum was present.

Old Business:

Standing Committee Chair Positions: Johna Sharp noted there are open positions in Fund Raising, Neighborhood Watch, Advertising, Compliance, Outdoor Recreational Activities, Residential Sales and Marketing, and Strategic Planning. A list of Committee Chairpersons is available in the office.

Arizona Corporation Commission: Johna Sharp advised that the Commission website is updated.

Check Signers: Earl Munday advised that all seven Directors are authorized check signers and the two former Directors have been removed from the account.

Chart of Accounts: Mary Newkirk advised that changes to the Chart of Accounts has not been made but will be changed to include the Kitchen Renovation Reserve Fund.

John's Villa: Lynn Campbell reported that John's Villa will close on May 31. Her

committee has many suggestions for use of the space and they are all under consideration.

Farnsworth Kitchen Keys: Mary Newkirk reported that Bea Westall and Cathy Jageler reviewed the keys and will keep in a new location. A copy of the keys will be in the office.

Administrative Service Manager Update: Johna Sharp introduced Jack Babb. Jack spoke about his experience and personal history in the Mesa area. Everyone welcomed him.

Farnsworth Hall Pool Deck Repair Contract: Larry Thoma advised that the deck repairs will be performed by Jasper Service Pro, DBA Specialty Cleaning Services as approved for \$4,808.50. Jasper has the commercial license for Specialty Cleaning Services. The pool will be closed the week of May 15. Signs will be posted at the pool and on the website. Jasper is providing a one-year warranty for the repairs.

The FH pool will close at 10 pm as of May 3. Signs will be posted at the pool and on the website.

New Business:

Farnsworth Hall: Earl Munday discussed the Pickleball group using the east end of Farnsworth Hall when it is too hot to play outside.

Cathy Jageler advised the Lumos Arts Academy would like to rent Farnsworth Hall for rehearsals and performance of their 6th grade talent production. They will purchase the standard Liability insurance and pay the standard deposit. This may lead to future bookings.

The directors agreed that we would not honor a quote from a previous Farnsworth Hall Manager which is below the current rate for a two-day Blues Brothers tribute event in May.

Read Hall: Earl Munday advised Policies and Procedures limits use of Read Hall to DVRC Members. If we want to take advantage of Read Hall's revenue potential, we need to make a change to Policies and Procedures.

Woodshop Expansion Proposal: Ron Wilson, lead Woodshop monitor, presented a few suggestions to increase the size of the Woodshop and address noise issues. He agreed to work with Lynn Campbell and the John's Villa ad hoc committee to find solutions.

Building and Grounds Summer Projects: Larry Thoma would like to upgrade the bathrooms at the Farnsworth pool while it is closed for Deck Repair. He would also like to upgrade the bathrooms at the Read pools. The work will be done by our maintenance staff.

There are many complaints at both pools about pool maintenance. It appears Pineapple may not have a commercial license. Proposals will be presented at a future meeting for a new company.

Other projects include stripping and resurfacing the stage floor at Farnsworth and a new gutter on Read Hall. Proposals will be submitted at the next board meeting, or at a special meeting.

Staffing: Johna Sharp advised that we will not hire a receptionist until the fall because the office is on their summer schedule and Jack needs time to adjust to his new position.

Larry Thoma will work with the Personnel committee to hire a part time employee for the summer to assist with the maintenance and upgrade projects outlined above. The funding is in the budget due to having spent less than budgeted to date in payroll category.

Office Hours: Mary Newkirk advised the summer schedule is 8 a.m. to 12 Noon. We need to consider additional hours for residents that work. She is on vacation May 9 - 22

Adjournment: Meeting was adjourned at 8 p.m.

Connie Dugan addressed concerns at the Read Hall Pool. She is happy to hear Larry is addressing her concerns.

Kathie Chismar is setting up a bus trip to Mataztal Casino on August 11 out of Farnsworth Hall.

Earl made a motion to approve the contract for Jasper Service Pro dba Specialty Cleaning Service for \$4808.50. The motion passed unanimously. **New Business:**

April 2018 Financial Statement: Mary Newkirk, Treasurer. Financial reports are on file in the office and on the official bulletin board. Earl made the motion to approve and it was passed unanimously.

Non-Member use of Read Hall: Earl made a motion for the following update to Policies and Procedures: On a limited basis, allow non-members of DVRC to use/rent Read Hall as long as their activity does not interfere with previously scheduled DVRC member events.

Discussion followed. The price will be set upon approval by the board and appropriate committee chairs. Policy and Procedures to be updated. The motion was unanimously approved.

Pool Maintenance Budget. How "E. Coli" Can Affect You

Practically everyone has heard of a food borne illness called "E. coli" and has learned of ways to avoid it: Washing hands, cooking food properly, washing raw vegetables before eating, etc. In this community, where dining out is a favorite social event, another consideration often overlooked is the restaurant table. Think about how it is "cleaned."

Before doing that, let's consider that nasty E. coli bacteria. The "E" is a scientific identification of the bacteria family "Escherichia." (Not very interesting is it?) The term "coli," however should get your attention. Coli refers to the colon or lower intestine of animals including the human animal. So, a primary source of E.coli comes from the lower intestine - fecal contamination. It doesn't take much imagination to picture how this contamination can transfer from an infected person, to a restaurant chair. Yep, that's the same chair we often see sitting upside-down on the table during floor cleaning.

Just as important, is the practice seen in cleaning the restaurant table for the next customer. As a former food sanitation inspector, I still watch restaurant employees closely and you should too. Do you see them clearing the table wiping both the chair seat AND the table surface? Was the cleaning-cloth or sponge sanitized or changed between customers? My observation has been that the cleaning cloth may last for the person's entire shift without being

sanitized. At room temperature, the cloth or sponge then becomes nothing more than a "petri dish" capable of spreading the bacteria on one chair to several tablesurfaces, condiment dispensers, and, of course, other chairs.

If you don't have the picture yet, I'll drop my effort to be sensitive. This is tantamount to wiping all the food surfaces with your neighbor's dirty underwear. When I see this practice, I do not return to the restaurant.
