By The Compliance Committee

For those who own recreational vehicles, please be aware that your RV cannot be stored on your property and extend beyond the front of your home. Also, no one is permitted to live in the RV while stored on your property. These are regulations of Maricopa County. Please be mindful of these regulations as they are in place for the safety of everyone.

Per Maricopa County, a recreation vehicle is described as a unit built on a truck, bus, or trailer chassis and equipped as a self-contained traveling home which is over 8 feet in height, 22.5 feet in length or over 10,000 pounds gross vehicle weight (GVW). If you wish to report a violation you can do so in the DVRC office or file a complaint online at: https://www.maricopa.gov/1683/ Code-Compliance. You will need the address or parcel number of the property in violation. You will also be asked to upload pictures and/or provide a description of the violation. If you provide an email address you will be notified of the progress. All complaints are kept anonymous. Let's all work together to reduce compliance issues.
