### DVRC GUESTS By Steve Malone

Who can Dreamland Villa members bring as guests to Dreamland Villa activities?

To answer this question, I would guide you to the rules and regulations as adopted by the Dreamland Villa Retirement Community Board of Directors on March 10th, 2020. Looking at the definitions of a guest, there are two types. One is called a Day Guest and is defined as those visitors who reside outside the borders of Dreamland Villa but in the greater Phoenix metropolitan area and are here to spend a day or less with a DVRC member.

The second type is a Household Guest/Out of Town guest/ Overnight Guest. These terms are used to define a friend or relative of a Dreamland Villa member who lives outside of the Dreamland area, usually from a more remote location, such as a visitor requiring overnight accommodations.

Residents of Dreamland Villa who are not members may not be a guest of a member to attend any Dreamland Villa activity. There is one exception, and that is if they are a guest attending a ticketed event where the guest will pay a different amount to participate in the event.

The reason I mention this is that we have a number of members who seem to think it is okay to bring a guest who lives in Dreamland Villa who is not a member. Please understand that all residents of Dreamland Villa have the same opportunity to purchase a membership to take advantage of the amenities and activities that Dreamland Villa Retirement Community provides. The Board of Directors has a

fine Board of Directors has a fiscal responsibility, and we must find the means to support and pay for the cost of operating Dreamland Villa. Therefore, residents of our community who are not members are also not guests and may not use our facilities.

In the future, closer attention will be paid to members who bring guests who are residents of Dreamland. Please understand that if you are a member, you may not bring your spouse, child, partner, or roommate as a guest to any of the activities of Dreamland, they must become a member. Guests create more costs for Dreamland Villa by using the pools, which require more maintenance, additional chemical applications, natural gas for heating the pools, and water usage. Other activities require more cleaning, maintenance, and repairs.

In the past, Dreamland Villa has been on the honor system with members bringing guests. Sorry to say we are at the point where we must change our reliance on the honesty of our members. If you violate the Dreamland Villa rules, please be aware that your membership may be revoked for the misuse of guest privileges.

Just as an example, at 1:00 p.m. on a Sunday in October, an individual came to the Read pool with her son and grandson. She was told that it was not kids' time at the pool, but they stayed anyway. In talking with the woman, it turns out that she is not a resident or member. She has a friend in Dreamland who is a member and gives her the card to use whenever she wants. That Kee card has been deactivated and will not be authorized to access any of the DVRC's facilities.

This will necessitate the need to monitor attendance at our pools by asking to see each occupant's Kee card when requested. Should you fail to have your key card with you, we will ask you to not use the pools in the future without your Kee card.

It is not fair for those paying for the facilities to pay for those who do not pay!

that is, "Which came first?". Do you not pay your fees, and therefore not use the amenities, or the other way around? Again, this year is a great year to give the amenities a try. If you've read or listened to any news about aging, you know that being physically active and weightlifting can add years to your life. It can also add quality to those years. Walking, of course, requires no equipment, and we have such nice wide streets and sidewalks. But If you have any knee, hip, or back issues, walking in the pool is a good alternative. Some people just float on a noodle and move their arms and legs for an hour while visiting with friends. The water takes away the pull of gravity and makes it much easier to exercise. You don't need to know how to swim, because there is a large shallow area. If you are worried about how you look in a swimsuit, remember that we are an over-55 community. Poolside at DVRC is no beauty contest! The first few times you may not get to know anyone, but as you come more often, people will recognize you and you can have a real conversation. The weight room has a wide variety of equipment for exercise, and a TV to

watch while you do it. Or perhaps talk with someone else who is getting their 20-30 minutes in.

You will have also heard and read that socialization adds quantity and quality to life and is protective against dementia. Now is the time to learn something new. Woodshop, lapidary, art, quilt, fused glass, and ceramics are all good options. You may think practically that you don't need any more junk, especially your own handmade junk. That is not the point. You can make it and throw it away. Or you may discover that you're really good at something. Perhaps you could begin your own club related to an interest that isn't presently available?

Finally, on the occasions that we have had family and friends visit, the amenities are very nice for them as guests of ours. Our kids and grandkids love being able to swim outdoors year-round. Other visitors have appreciated being able to do their workouts. We had fun trying to learn pickleball with another set of visitors. One of the things I like best about DVRC is that it is not pretentious—commonly called "snooty". Hope to see you around!

In writing this article for the February edition of the Citizen, it's early January. On my mind is the renewal process for the annual membership for Dreamland Villa. The great news is that we have renewed approximately the same number of members at the same time as a year ago, even with the fee increase. This is approximately 1/3 of the annual membership. That is a positive note, and it seems like we will be on track to retain membership for 2024. However, I truly understand many of your concerns about the rising price of fees for membership and the effect of paying \$250 to \$500 all in a one-time payment. To assist, we have arranged an ACH process with our Chase Bank account to allow members to make payments on a monthly, quarterly, or semiannual basis. This process will set up an automatic withdrawal from your checking or savings account to make the payments per your wishes, on the frequency and date you wish the withdrawal to take place. To take advantage of this process, please stop in the office or call 480 832-3461 for instruc-

The Dreamland Villa Bylaws require that the annual membership fees be paid by January 31st of the membership year. Anyone who has not renewed by January 31st is subject to having their Kee card deactivated. To avoid this we are extending the due date until February 10th, 2024, to make renewals. After February 10, your Kee card will no longer work, and you will have to come to the office to reactivate it by paying current membership fees. Please understand if you were a member in 2023 and you choose not to reactivate your Kee card until later in the year, (say in June) you still owe the membership for the entire year of 2024.

It is definitely not my intent to be threatening, but this is the process that we must follow. Membership is the heart of our community. We need as many members of the community to join and renew annually to maintain our facilities and to retain the 55-plus senior overlay.

Many of you who attended the Annual Meeting on January 20th were allowed to hear from the candidates who

are running for the Board of Directors. I hope you were able to determine who will best serve our community. Voting for these candidates will be on February 13th, beginning at 8:00 am and concluding at 7:00 pm. The voting will take place at the Read Hall complex. Those of you who may be out of our community, disabled, or ill, may obtain an absentee ballot from Monday, February 5th to Monday, February 12th. Absentee voting will take place at the Dreamland Villa office at the Read Hall complex. Should you be unable to come to the office, please contact us at 480- 832-3461 and we will arrange to bring a ballot to your home and witness your vote.

You may be tired of hearing this from me, but we need to keep in mind Dreamland Villa is our community, not just a select number of people who are at the forefront. We are your representatives; we are not the Community, we all are. If you are available, please volunteer to support the many activities that go on in Dreamland, and help us create future events that are beneficial to all.

#### WARD JENNINGS

I am an incumbent Director and the Treasurer since July 16, 2022.

To better inform our Community of unusual financial transactions, I routinely add footnotes to the monthly financial statements. The most significant footnote disclosure: the IRS's \$11,837 penalties and interest charged to DVRC. (See Footnotes to the September 2023 financial statements.) We are still waiting for an IRS response to my letters requesting abatement.

One of my goals is to make sure Dreamland Villa avoids future needless conflict with the IRS. (Yes, Dreamland Villa has an IRS non-profit status, but it also has taxable unrelated business income resulting from the Farnsworth Hall and cell phone tower leases.) With a Bachelor of Science in Accounting, Master of Business Administration, and 30+ years of financial management experience in the construction industry, I have the expertise to document legitimate

deductions to reduce future taxable unrelated business income and the ability to pay estimated quarterly taxes and file tax returns on time.

Dreamland Villa invested \$225,000 in the last 15 months, repairing aging facilities and equipment including the swimming pools and hot tubs. It is imperative to have a Treasurer who will keep our Community informed about Dreamland Villa's cash flow and whether it will be able to fund future costly repairs.

As a homeowner in our Community since 2007, my goal as a director has always been to preserve our Community's 55+ age requirements. I constantly take action against ambivalent landlords who are willing to rent their properties to any age person. I also contact Realtors and their brokers when their advertising fails to disclose our Community's age requirements.

My greatest joy, however, is preparing Sunday morning breakfast (eggs, bacon, and pancakes mixed with applesauce and bananas) for my two sons and their families before our hikes.



## **Book Club**



## Holiday Lights Contest






