PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

There seems to be some misunderstanding about what DVRC actually is and what it is responsible for, so I thought I'd write my message about this for better clarification.

Dreamland Villa Retirement Community (DVRC) is the name of the corporation that oversees the Senior Citizen (SC) overlay of the Dreamland Villa housing development, and it's owned common areas and facilities. The Corporation's members are comprised of occupants who pay an annual fee to help manage and maintain these facilities, and the office staff administers and maintains the records for the SC overlay. Any occupant that resides within our development may become a member of the Corporation simply by paying the appropriate fees.

The facilities owned by DVRC include the Read Hall complex, the Library, a nearby vacant lot, the Farnsworth

Hall complex and another vacant lot, and the Nature Walk. Each complex is comprised of many amenities, and the Nature Walk provides a walking trail through desert land-scape. The Nature Walk is also where utilities and SRP power lines cross through our housing development.

All of these spaces are known as the common areas and are the spaces for which the corporation's Board of Directors has a responsibility and authority. These responsibilities include insuring that all of Its assets and facilities are properly managed and/or maintained. All directors and committee members are volunteers and there are two paid full-time office staff.

Other than the building in which we have our modest library, DVRC does not own any other houses within the Dreamland Villa housing development. DVRC is not a Homeowner's Association (HOA) and therefore, the responsibility for individual property maintenance lies with the individual property owner and Maricopa County. (The Dreamland Villa Development is a Maricopa County island, and is not part of the City of Mesa)

Per HUD and HOPA regulations, at least one member within the household must be at least 55 years old and no

one under the age of 18 is permitted to permanently live within the DVRC housing development. While the DVRC directors, committee volunteers and its office staff can attempt to assist with various property and housing code violations, DVRC legally cannot do anything but try to help. It's up to our residents to maintain the neighborhoods. If young children are living in a home, perhaps the occupant is unaware that it's not permitted in a 55+ community. It is possible that the realtor or homeowner may not have informed the occupant that they must comply with the HUD and HOPA regulations. So be kind. Ask your neighbor if they need assistance or if they are aware of the regulations. File a report with the County as a last resort but do report those who simply will not comply.

Filing a complaint with the County is simple and all complaints remain anonymous. If there is a home in the neighborhood you would like to report to the County, you can do so online, by US Mail or a phone call. Call or come by the DVRC office for more information or to pick up a brochure on how the process works. And thank you for helping to keep Dreamland Villa a great place to live.



Another issue that has been brought to our attention is that people don't use their directional lights, or put them on when they're actually making the turn. The more communication that you have with other drivers, the safer you will be.

When I was teaching my kids to drive I always stressed the point that if they don't do anything unexpected, they have a much better chance of staying safe. Remember, directional lights are a signal of intention, not execution! If a deputy or police officer is looking for a reason to pull you over for some reason, not using your directional could be that reason. It is the law!

We've all driven Higley and Power Rd enough to have seen a major accident at some point. The main causes seem to be inattention and impatience. Red light runners are bordering on ridiculous! There is nothing that important that people should take a chance on getting killed or seriously hurt, only to end up at the next stoplight a half a mile down the road. You've all seen them; the light turns yellow 500 feet before them and instead of slowing down, they accelerate to attempt to beat the light. The results are often devastating!

The best bet is to wait to enter the intersec-

tion until you're sure all traffic coming the other way is stopped. Vehicles making a left turn are a leading cause of accidents also. I personally know how dangerous it is on a motorcycle. People don't seem to be able to judge the speed that a motorcycle is going, and think they have plenty of time to make the turn. I've lost many friends because the vehicle driver "didn't see them". You may not like motorcycles, but they are a legal form of transportation, and should be given the same caution as any other vehicle. Just think to yourself, "Would I turn in front of this vehicle if it was a semi?"

I hope everyone had a safe and Happy Thanksgiving, and are busy with Christmas shopping and decorating. Even though as more people are returning, and our "house checks" are becoming fewer and fewer, the Dreamland Villa Sheriff's Posse still has lots to do. Call to Order: 6:30pm by Johna Sharp, President

Roll Call: Kathie Chismar, Secretary. Present were Johna Sharp, Earl Munday, Dan Hampton, Kathy Wissinger, Larry Thoma, Aggie Forsyth, and Kathie Chismar. A quorum was present.

Old Business:

Pickle Ball Court: Dave Senke advised that his committee sought 4 estimates for repairs, with Pacific Tennis Courts submitting the lowest bid. They have good reviews and 30 years' experience. Their contract has been submitted to the contract committee.

New Business:

Building and Grounds: The purchase of pool vacuums that would be put in the pool overnight was discussed. At the present time, we

do not have anyone to install the vacuums at night, so the motion to purchase the vacuums will be tabled till further notice.

Pineapple Pools has advised that extra maintenance and additional pool closures may be needed due to the buildup of lotions and detergents in the pool. It is imperative that everyone shower before entering the pool. If anyone is interested in being a Pool Monitor, please notify the office. We will post additional signs to remind people to shower before entering the pool.

Annual General Membership Meeting: It was suggested that we hold the Annual meeting at 6:30pm on January 8, 2019.

By-Laws: The board reviewed by-law changes to be presented at the 2019 general membership. The changes would be published on the website and available in the office for the membership to review, as they are too lengthy to publish in the Citizen.

Senior Citizen Overlay: There are a few apartments on the edge of Dreamland that are not covered under the Senior Citizen Overlay. Earl suggested that we send letters to the

owners to request that they provide affidavits to DVRC stipulating that the occupants meet the 55+ rules in their rental agreements so that the renters can pay the annual fee and enjoy the Dreamland amenities. If the owners refuse, the properties should be removed from the Overlay, and the renters would not be permitted to purchase membership.

2019 Operating Budget: Dan is working on the 2019 budget based on 2018 operating expenses and income projections. The budget will be submitted to the Board at the December meeting.

SRP Easement: SRP has requested a new Easement on the Nature Walk. They have offered to pay \$900 for the easement, but it may be worth more. Negotiations will continue.

John's Villa Ad Hoc Committee Report: A new proposal was submitted for the John's Villa space suggesting a lending library and increased storage, kitchen and card playing space. The proposal will be available in the office

Nature Walk: Dave Senke reported on the

history and policies and procedures regarding the nature walk. Landscaping must meet required guidelines and must receive written approval from the Board. Owners must accept liability for items placed on the trail.

There is a Nature Walk Cleanup scheduled for November 15.

General grammatical corrections - i.e. adding or deleting apostrophes, commas, plurals, etc.

Deleting outdated or duplicate references i.e. references to constitution, social memberships, etc.

Reducing or clarifying restrictions on actions (in most cases to comply with actions currently being taken) - i.e. day of Board meetings, filling of vacant positions, etc.

The complete text of the proposed changes is available on the Website and at the office (red words are added, strike throughs are deleted). The complete text will also be available at the entrance to the Annual Membership meeting on January 8, 2019 at 6:30 at Farnsworth Hall.
