Investigate and respond to all worthwhile, suitable and signed complaints filed by DVRC residents, involving the appropriate governmental agencies as necessary, and work with all parties involved to achieve the rules and regulations established by the Board of Directors, the By-Laws and the appropriate Policies and Procedures.

Encourage and facilitate the formation of Neighborhood Watch groups within the boundaries of DVRC. Coordinate with the County Neighborhood Watch Groups as necessary

Outdoor Recreation Activities Commit-

Act as the liaison with and promote interest in the various outdoor activities including, but not limited to, swimming, bowling,

an acceptable and fair resolution within golf, shuffleboard, horseshoes, pickle ball and bocce ball. Solicit suggestions from DVRC residents for improvement in current outdoor activities and suggestions for new activities.

From time to time we have donated things such as lift chairs and mobility scooters and so on that we want to pass along to our friends in Dreamland Villa and Velda Rose Estates for a donation. Part of that donation includes free delivery to their home.

The other type of delivery service is delivering hospital beds, which includes trained setup staff. Also delivered at no charge are baby beds and trapezes at no charge. Any other item for delivery or pickup is a flat-rate of \$25. This may be old hat to some of you folks, but to the newbies here in our corner of Paradise, it's news. So, should you find something that Help Services has for donation but wondered how you would get it home, here lies the answer. It's as easy as 1-2-3.

At Help Services, you will find rows and rows of medical equipment such as Polar Care, along with cushions of all kinds, bath tub whirlpools, bed pans, body lift, plus the following: hospital beds, commodes, toilet risers (with and without handrails), knee-walkers that fold, canes of all kinds (some quads, some folding, etc.), crutches, C-walkers, wheeled walkers wheelchairs and beds, just to mention a few.

Our friends from the north will soon be arriving for their winter stay so if there are some new folks on your street, make sure you say "Hi" and tell them about Help Services and the medical equipment Help Services has to offer. Also if you would, as a favor to me, ask them if they would like to join our volunteer group. We do need your help, plus it is really fun, thanks!


A BOOK REVIEW: 10 Big Ones
