Seems like this summer is flying by but before it goes, I'd like to thank the Singles Club for all the work they do to support our Dreamland Villa residents and DVRC. The 4th of July Beans and Brats Celebration was a fun respite from the heat and the food was plentiful. This special group of gals and guys put on a great spread along with the help of many other volunteers.

The support that the Singles Group provides shows

all of us that many of our Dreamland residents support DVRC and want to keep our facilities in place and maintained. Without the support of this group, and the residents that pay our ridiculously low annual fee, we run the risk of losing our facilities. The cost of maintaining our facilities continues to increase, while our annual fee has remained the same for the past five years.

Starting in 2022, our annual fee will increase to \$190 per person. This is only an annual increase of \$15 and these additional funds will be applied towards much-needed upgrades of our air conditioners and other required maintenance.

As you know, we cannot operate without sufficient air conditioning of our facilities. Many of our current air conditioners are old and may require replacement. Our Maintenance staff will also be looking into other muchneeded repairs.

DVRC needs the help of all our residents. We need your loyalty and financial support if we are to continue to provide the events and activities that many of our residents have grown to love. Our facilities belong to the Dreamland Villa community, and it is your responsibility to support and maintain them, whether you use them or not. It is unfortunate that we do not have an HOA, be-

cause if we did, every homeowner would be required to financially support our facilities. Even so, the responsibility remains with each of us. If every homeowner in Dreamland were to pay the annual fee, we would have sufficient funding to not only better maintain our facilities, but to provide more quality activities and events.

Please be responsible and pay the annual fee of \$190 this coming year. DVRC needs your help and commitment. Let's all work together to support our community so that we can all enjoy our facilities and so that they remain here for the future of Dreamland Villa.



2022 ANNUAL FEE INCREASE

At the May 12, 2021 Board of Directors' meeting for Dreamland Villa Retirement Community, the directors voted unanimously to increase the annual fee for 2022 to \$190 per person. We wanted to get this information out to our members as soon as possible, so everyone can plan for the increase. After no increases for 5 years, this is only a 9% rise in fees. The annual amount breaks down to only \$15.83 a month, payable annually, to enjoy all of the amenities and activities Dreamland Villa Retirement Community offers. More importantly, the fees subsidize the cost of maintaining our 55+ status and our community's facilities, as well as allows DVRC to keep its office open and serving the residents of Dreamland Villa. 
It is with mixed feelings and a heavy heart that I will not be holding the 'LOVE TO DANCE' program that we had at Farnsworth Hall this last spring.


