I know that many of our out-of-towners were unable to make it back here this past


season and we hope to see you this coming fall. We've missed you and hope that you will continue to support us in our efforts to keep Dreamland Villa a great place to live.

Your donations can be dropped off at 5340 E Colby Street in a basket I keep on the front porch.



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
POSSE CORNER

Our resident nurse Debra Traskos and our president Patty Thorp are working on getting this Help Services service going again. It turns out to be an insurance issue. More on this as we keep working it out.

A Help Service update, our new computer system is running just fine. Folks are getting the hang of it. Patty, our President says she has it down now. I understand that our monitors are doing well on the computer as well. There are some good things to report from

Help Services. There are silver linings, you just have to look around for them.

Well here at Help Services we say, "Yes we have the medical items you need", such as portable rollaway beds, folding chairs, toys for the grandchildren, baby beds, highchairs, booster seats, playpens, hospital beds, commodes, toilet risers (with and without hand rails), knee-walkers that fold, canes of all different kinds (some quads, some folding, etc.), crutches, C- walkers, wheelchairs in different sizes, beds, exercise bicycle with no doctor's letter.

Book Review

Karolina's Twins by Ronald H. Balson

This book is historical fiction about Lena who was a 17-year-old Jewish girl living happily with her parents and younger brother in Chrzanow Poland when the Nazis invaded. Life quickly went from great to terrible and then got even worse. During these terrible years she made a promise to her life-long friend Karolina and now many years later she has decided to hire a lawyer, Catherine Lockhart and private investigator Liam Taggart to help her fulfill that promise.

It is a very well-written book. Lena gives detailed descriptions of the awful things that happened in concentration camps and to Jewish people in general. During the time it takes her to tell her story to Catherine, Lena's son, Arthur decides to take his mother to court to try to have her declared incompetent and have her sent to a home. There are triumphs and defeats. There are tears, joy a lot of twists and turns and many surprises.

I highly recommend this book, it's very interesting if you want to learn more about World War II. It was hard to put down. May we never forget the terrible things that were done to people during that awful time.



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
