Our community needs more people that are willing to greet our new residents and tell them about the good things and why they need to buy a kee card. We need people that will spread a positive word about our community, not negative. Instead, some of our people have decided to move in the opposite direction and divide us.

This recall isn't about the Board of Directors, it's about some unhappy residents that have chosen to put their energy into negative works






Different types of exercise bicycles that is available at Help Services.

We also check for unauthorized use of pools, bocce courts, paddle ball courts and the nature walk that runs the length of our community under the SRP transmission corridor. It is our hope to prevent vandalism and theft of property to make your retirement community safe. Our vehicles are SUVs

through the generous contributions of our friends and neighbors.

Please take time to post this important information where you can easily find it: DVRC phone # (602) 877-

8489. This number is available 9am to 8pm Monday thru Saturday. A member of the POSSE monitors this telephone # and will get back to you as soon as possible. Our office is not staffed full time. After hours or on Sunday please call 9-1-1 in case of emergency! (And THEN call the POSSE office).

When traveling away from DVRC we encourage you to make use of "House Check" forms and let us know your house will be vacant. Our officers will check for signs of vandalism or intrusion and pick up newspapers, door tags or business cards left on your doorstep copa County Sheriff's Office little plastic bags with peb- at the center!" (MCSO) and are maintained bles. All these things signal

to intruders that you are not home. House Check forms are available in the blue/ gray box by the POSSE office door. Just fill out the form and put it in the black mailbox also by the office door. There is no charge for our HC service.



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
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
