Just a few notes of some important things that have been happening at the Dreamland Villa Read Hall Office and campus:

HOLIDAY CRAFT FAIR

Dreamland Villa will host a Craft Fair to ring in the holidays on December 10, 2022, 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This Craft Fair will be held both inside and outside of Read Hall. Vendors that

But we owe our thanks to all who baked potatoes, cooked chili, sliced and diced condiments and provided drinks, plates and utensils. Great job everyone and great potatoes too!

We are often asked what the Posse does? In a brief summation from our Mission Statement:

We perform high visibility patrols in marked security vehicles throughout the residential areas within Dreamland Villas.

We relay information to the Sheriff's Office for law enforcement situations, being good witnesses to any crimes we observe.

We assist Law Enforcement Officers (LEO's) whenever called upon to do so in traffic control situations or public emergencies.

We make crime prevention information available at no cost to our area citizens.

We patrol the DVRC Nature Walk looking for signs of trash dumping, vandalism and unauthorized use of the grounds such as overnight camping.

And we continue to perform the duties of our very popular House Check Program.

What we can't do:

- The posse does NOT carry weapons!
- We DO NOT detain or arrest anyone!
- We will not get involved in suspicious activity where a LEO would be required.

We are the eyes and ears of our community while we are on patrol. Our responsibility is the safety of citizens of Dreamland Villas and visitors who need our assistance. Just like our residents we are empowered to call 9-1-1 when we believe our community is in danger by suspicious persons or situations.

The Posse is a volunteer uniformed security organization for our community, sworn to protect the citizens and defend the Constitution of the United States of America. At times we are a resource group the MCSO may choose to call into service as needed. Beyond that we are your neighbors too! It is our pleasure to serve you!

THE NATURE WALK

The nature walk is the reason I am in Dreamland Villa. I fell in love with the backyard of my home because it backs up to the trail. It is beautiful and a different place than what I am accustomed to, being from Nebraska, it is a different green. The differing vegetation intrigued me from the first time I saw it. When my grandkids come to visit it is the first place they want to go.

You can tell I have a deep appreciation for the nature walk and wanted to maintain it in the best condition that is possible. We all know that this nature walk draws people from all over the community of Mesa. It is a beacon for our residents and visitors to come and walk the trail, it represents the Dreamland Villa community as a tranquil, clean, and safe place.

I took my first calling at helping the Nature Trail cleanup, a few weeks ago. I was excited to do it. I want to be a part of maintaining the trail, so I am putting my labor where my mouth is.

Here is the rub. It felt like all we were doing was cleaning up brush and debris from the back of individual residents' homes who had piled debris, thinking the cleanup crew would take it away. To be honest that kind of made me a little angry. Here I am, a volunteer, cleaning up someone else's backyard. Then I started to think they are doing us a favor by cleaning up the trail close to their lot line. I am sure that is the case in many instances. But from what I saw I could not understand why the individuals did not just pull their garbage can around and slowly put the debris in their trash can and have it taken away by their refuse service. They spent a lot of time and effort neatly stacking the debris into piles. I thought the best thing to do was to talk to these people and hear their point of view and thoughts. I did not want to go and read them the riot act with the Dreamland Villa Nature Walk Policy in hand. I just wanted to hear what they have to say before I made any judgment.

When you go and knock on someone's door, and you are a stranger, and they have signs that say no soliciting etc., it is a little nerve wracking at first, both for the person answering the door and for myself as a person wanting to ask them some questions about the trail. The funny thing is once we started talking, we all could understand each other's view-

points and I learned that a lot of things with respect to what is going on in the trail have been from past practices. Years ago, the cleanup crews would come around with a woodchipper making it easy to handle large piles of debris quickly. Times have changed, the cost to get someone to come in with a chipper is now very expensive which limits our abilities.

In the last few years cleanup has been primarily with a pickup truck and plastic barrels to put the debris in, then haul it in the truck over to one of the dumpsters either at Farnsworth Hall or Read Hall for disposal. This has tied our hands on how much debris can be handled per clean up.

Everyone I have talked to who lives on the trail has a unique fondness for the beauty in their backyard provided by the Nature Walk. So as our discussions went along, we tried to find solutions to manage the debris removal issue. The situation is that we have a lot of debris to manage. We need more than our own garbage cans. What if we take the initiative to contact one of the local garbage services to see if they do any community service projects and would be willing to donate one of their garbage trucks and a driver for a morning? Maybe twice yearly we could have the driver drive the truck and we would have volunteers who could load the debris into them. At first, I thought a big roll-off dumpster would be ideal but, further thoughts revealed that we may get more trash than brush. If folks saw empty dumpsters, they may just use it to load house trash instead of trail debris, so we nixed that idea.

You would think the moral of this story is about the nature trail. My moral of this story is just talking to people and understanding their points of view and collaborating to make things better. I can tell you I was nervous going to those doors and knocking on them with the story I had to tell. However, they listened, understood, and we built a relationship with each other that I think will flourish in the future and will help the Dreamland Villa Community, which is all I am trying to do.

Oh, by the way, anytime you see an article in the citizen newspaper about trail cleanup, come and join me and your other neighbors. Whether you live on the trail or not, it is fun, you learn a lot, and you meet new people.
