Delta Airlines bought Western and moved them to Atlanta, GA. Joe and Andrea enjoyed many trips abroad, many of them hiking adventures. They built two brick homes in Fayetteville.

They bought a camper and a Jeep and set about exploring National Parks.

Roll Call of Newly Elected Directors and Con-

tinuing Directors by Johna Sharp, President: Present were continuing Directors: Johna Sharp, Allees Cohrt, Ward Jennings and newly elected Directors: Anthony Pagano and Steve Malone.

Report Results of the February 8, 2022 Election of Directors: Bea Westall, Nominating Committee Chair, read the results of the election held February 8, 2022. Steve Malone received 198 votes, Anthony Pagano received 182 votes and Earline Parham received 190 votes. They were each elected to a threeyear term. Debra Bunten received 128 votes. Earline resigned effective April 1, 2022.

Report Results of the March 8, 2022 Special Board Meeting's Election of Officers: Bea announced Anthony Pagano was elected President, Steve Malone as Vice President and Ward Jennings as Treasurer. Earline Parham had been elected Secretary, but has since resigned. Swearing in of the Newly Elected Directors and Officers: Bea swore in Anthony Pagano as the Board's new President. Anthony then swore in Steve Malone as a new Director and Vice President and Ward Jennings as Treasurer.

New Business:

January 15, 2022 Annual Meeting's By Law Changes: Johna made a motion to accept and immediately adopt all the By Law changes approved by the members at the January 15, 2022 Annual Meeting. The motion was adopted unanimously.

Nominations for Election of Secretary: Ward was selected to be Secretary by acclamation.

Check signers: Johna made a motion to rescind former Directors Ron Reed's, Kim Rogers's and Kathie Chismar's authorization to be check signers and to authorize the new check signers, effective April 1, 2022, to be Anthony Pagano, Steve Malone, Johna Sharp, Allees Cohrt and Ward Jennings.

TWO-LEVEL MEMBERSHIP: Are things as simple as they seem?

In my last article, I proposed a two-level membership for Dreamland Villa Retirement Community (hereafter referred to as DVRC). It seemed simple, just create another level with each level having its own cost of membership. Well, hold on, for every action there is always an equal and opposite reaction. So, what will the opposite reaction be?

Before I dive into that discussion, it is important to understand the benefits that a current DVRC members receive from paying the annual fee, they support the 55 plus and all the amenities, clubs, and facilities, (hereafter referred to as benefits) that DVRC provides.

From my discussions with members, some do not participate in the DVRC benefits. They pay the annual membership fee just to support our Dreamland community. They also see the DRVC benefits as providing an increase to their home value when they decide to sell. This specific knowledge brings us to the question of what happens regarding the funding of Dreamland Villa's member benefits if we do go to a two-level membership plan

Here is the "reaction." Current members will have the option to remain a full paying Active member at today's cost of \$190 and receive all the benefits. Their other choice under two-level membership would be the Residential membership that only supports the 55 plus at today's cost of \$48. The outcome of this decision will create the equal and opposite reaction.

This is where I have concerns with my philosophy of two-level membership. It is not my objective to do anything to harm membership dues paid to maintain DVRC benefits. It was to provide another level of membership to insure our 55 plus status and as a tool to promote community pride.

To address this issue, we must determine the number of current DVRC members that would change their membership to the Residential membership level, which will result in lower revenues. To determine this, it will require the random sampling of the current membership to find out how they would react to the question. Will they continue to financially support DRVC's benefits? Or will they only fund the 55 plus community designation of Dreamland Villa.

If DVRC is not able to maintain at least the current financial support for benefits, then we must rethink our entire process. This information can tell us what the future holds for the DVRC member benefits and the facilities. Please do not panic, I am not saying Dreamland is closing anything down or stopping any activities. I am just brainstorming, gathering facts, talking with others, and evaluating things, which is what this is all about.

In my mind, the way to answer this question is to develop a survey to gain this information from current members. I want the questions to be neutral, so we get a true response. This is necessary to determine if the Active membership will be able to retain the funding of benefits. Residential members are not going to be willing to subsidize the Active membership.

If the results are positive and we feel we can move forward without jeopardizing the Active member benefits, we can take the next step. A random sample survey conducted of current non-member residents will evaluate their level of acceptance to funding of the 55 plus program. In addition, the data will be the baseline for the number of potential Residential memberships, which will help to establishing membership cost.

To conduct this survey, we will use estimated dollar costs to determine their level of financial support.
