Membership

By the time of this publication, you should have received the 2024 membership letter and affidavit form. These were hand-delivered by volunteers during the last weeks of November and early December. The affidavit forms need to be completed and returned to the office by every resident in order to maintain the 55+ status. Your dues may be paid in cash, check, or credit card. The office will be open during its regular hours, Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. To assist the office staff, the marketing committee will be available in the former Posse office from 9:00 am-1:00 pm Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday through December 22nd, and from January 3rd through the 31st to receive cash or check payments. In addition, they will be at the December 2nd Craft Fair. Only office staff can accept credit card payments. You can give your card number over the phone or pay with a credit card in person. (It is important to note that the 3% fee Dreamland Villa is charged for credit will be added to your fee.) To make the dues easier to pay, Dreamland Villa is now allowing monthly, quarterly, and semi-annual payments in addition to the annual payment. If you prefer to break down your payments, simply go to the office and register your bank with the staff. The fees will automatically be withdrawn at the times you specify.

The Marketing Committee wants to thank you for paying your fee and give some incentive to those people who haven't been paying. Therefore, each resident who pays their annual fee will receive a coupon book. The total value

of the approximately 40 coupons is easily over \$200. They come from a large variety of highquality, local small businesses, including restaurants, retail, entertainment, and personal services. We think you will enjoy using the coupons to support small businesses in our area AND support Dreamland Villa Retirement Community too. As you use the coupons, be sure to say thank you to our merchants. If you pay in person, you can collect your coupon book at the time of payment. If you pay by mail, you will need to go to the office to collect your coupon book(s).

But wait! There's more! The name of every resident who pays their dues before the annual meeting on January 20th will be entered into a drawing for several gift card prizes, to be awarded at the meeting.

Saturday, November 4th a Special Membership meeting was attended by over 226 members of our community and both items received support from the membership. The annual membership fee was increased to \$250 with a vote of 179 to 43. The amendment to the bylaws relating to the transfer fees was approved with a vote of 198 to 20.

The approval of the fee increase will allow the Board of Directors to provide financial security for the fiscal year 2024. In addition, it will allow for the replenishment of the capital reserve fund used to maintain our facilities.

It is understandable that many may not be able to make such a large payment all at once. The Board has provided for semiannual, quarterly, or monthly payments by use of auto-pay from your bank. The office has a form you can take to your banking institution and authorize them to make the payments from your account to Dreamland Villa on the payment plan you de-

As the President of Dreamland Villa Retirement Community, I believe this session made it perfectly clear that all residents of Dreamland Villa should contribute to support the continuing effort to maintain our 55-plus age-restricted status. The consensus of the attendees was that all residents of Dreamland Villa value the fact that our community is 55-plus, our streets are clean and safe, and our community is friendly.

To maintain this value, we must

ensure that realtors, brokers, and title companies are aware of the declarations of restrictions of each of our 18 sections of Dreamland Villa. To verify this, it requires that we have age affidavits renewed on a biennial basis to present to the Maricopa County Department of Planning and Development. These efforts require financial resources and today those finances have come from the members who pay the membership fee. Those fees not only retain the 55-plus but also the other activities and amenities that Dreamland Villa offers.

The members of Dreamland Villa incorporated would like to see those residents of Dreamland who are not members of the corporation contribute to the maintenance of the 55-plus age restriction expense. One possible way to achieve this could be the establishment of a multi-tier membership. The initial level would represent all residents of the community supporting the funding for the 55-plus program being the standard membership, and an increased level of membership would access the amenities and facilities of the corporation.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to thank everyone for their participation in the Saturday, November 4th Special Membership meeting. I remind you that Dreamland Villa is our community, and each resident must play an active role in its success. The success of Dreamland Villa is dependent upon each of us.

THE IRS AND DREAMLAND VILLA

When Dreamland Villa was initially chartered, the IRS designated it as a 501(c) (7) nonprofit corporation. Until December 2021, its revenue has been tax-exempt since the revenue was from its members.

Two events in December 2021 changed DVRC's relationship with the IRS.

First, DVRC leased Farnsworth Hall to T2 Presents, LLC. The lease payments are considered by the IRS to be unrelated business income, therefore taxable revenue received from sources other than DVRC's members.

Secondly, DVRC incurred a tax liability when the former library building was sold for \$175,000.

What changed?

First, DVRC is now required to pay QUARTERLY estimated taxes on the taxable income, not later than the 15th of the month following the end of the quarter.

Second, DVRC is now required to file an additional tax return, IRS Form 990-T. Third, the IRS allows DVRC to deduct legitimate expenses incurred to generate the unrelated business income, resulting in a lower tax liability.

DVRC has another challenge: Governing documents need to be revised to meet the IRS 501(c) (7) nonprofit requirements demonstrating that the corporation is organized for the social and recreational benefit of its members and is not providing prohibited services and benefits. This issue shall be addressed at the 2024 annual membership meeting.

1 The State of Arizona chartered the corporation named Dreamland Villa Community Club in 1961. In January 2017 the members overwhelmingly changed the name to Dreamland Villa Retirement Community, (DVRC).
