Stinknet

With our recent rain on March 6, 2025, the Stinknet weed will germinate within the next 7 to 15 days. The best time to destroy it is in the early stages before it matures. You can use a hula hoe at this point, and you do not need to pick up any of the weed as it has not produced buds. If you see it in your yard, it is critical that you dispose of it as quickly as possible because it produces millions of seeds that can lay dormant for five or more years. It may take more than one hoeing as it germinates at various rates.

Please help by maintaining your yard. That will also assist us in controlling the infestation of the Nature Walk. Below are some pictures of Stinknet to use as a guide for identification. Thank you for your help.

As we get older, it is important to stay healthy and on top of our time. If you have tried to schedule a doctor's appointment recently, you might have had to go up and down on your phone calendar to check out your availability. Then if you are required to see a specialist, that is another appointment that will need to be scheduled. Fortunately, here are some steps you can take to get into the doctor's office sooner.

Check to see if the office has multiple locations: Many doctors can see you in a variety of locations, some of which are slower than others.

Ask to be put on the cancellation list. Let the office know you would like to be notified if an earlier appointment opens, as many people do not show up.

If you need a specialist, ask your doctor to call on your behalf. Depending on the situation, most doctors can refer you to the specialist and call on your behalf, or in this digital world, send over the orders to squeeze you in.

Consider using providers that may not be doctors; Nurse practitioners and doctors assistants tend to have a much more available schedule than the main doctor. The Nurse practitioners and doctor's assistants work closely with their doctors to figure out how to best treat you. These practitioners can spend more time with you, and once you are in their system, the next appointments are quicker and easier to get.

Lastly, there are Tele doctors. The mobile app is a wonderful gadget. The Sr Tech Class will

Detective Roberts and his partner from the Maricopa County Sheriff's Department Financial Crimes Unit presented a plethora of information on the various scams that present themselves to us on a daily basis through phone calls, text, mail, email, social media, and persons knocking on our doors. Techniques such as "hang up", "don't respond", "don't buy them gift cards", "don't send wire transfers to them", "resist the pressure" and "don't call them back" are just few of the ways to stay safe. The officers had many handouts available for participants, as well as several slides with websites to use for more information on what types of techniques scammers are using. Neighborhood Watch By Shannon Rees


I moved here three years ago to become a full-time resident, and I am excited to be part of the community. I love my street and my neighbors; everyone is so friendly and we all help each other. Of course, I wanted to get more involved.

I reached out to the Neighborhood Watch to see how I could contribute. Chris Mortimer, who had recently restarted the program, explained that she needed help for personal reasons, so I volunteered to work with her. At that time, the board approved my involvement, making me the chairperson and Chris the co-chair.

Initially, we focused on reorganizing the neighborhood watch program. We worked on establishing a communication network, street by street, to ensure that information reached the Posse, allowing them to patrol problem areas more frequently. Our goal was to help everyone feel safe in our neighborhood.

In the past, I have taken several steps to promote a more positive neighborhood. I encouraged block parties and organized a scavenger hunt during the summer, where I donated prizes. I also spoke with residents about their concerns and tried to assist them as best as I could. Additionally, I created and printed pamphlets and block captain verification forms for the block captains to distribute. I have dedicated my time and resources to ensure these initiatives were successful. However, in the past few months, I haven't been able to invest much effort into community building due to some age-related issues that have arisen among residents.





Pledge of Allegiance

Call to Order: Heather Canterbury, President

Roll Call: Joyce Canino, Secretary. Directors: Heather Canterbury, Dave Warren, Beth White (phone), Pat Clark, Bob Westall and Joyce Canino. All present.

Ratification of Minutes: Pat motioned to ratify the February 11, 2025, Board of Director's meeting minutes. Dave seconded, passed unanimously. Pat motioned to ratify the Board of Director's March 4, 2025, Study Session minutes. Bob seconded, passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Pat had a handout for the January 2025 Profit and Loss (in the digital library under financials).

Office Manager Report: January had 11 properties closed with 7 paying \$550 (transfer and escrow) and 11 paying the \$150 escrow, 5 returned the senior age affidavits. February had 48 houses on the market, 11 properties closed with 8 paying \$550 (transfer and escrow) and 3 paying the \$150 escrow, 10 returned the senior age affidavits. Currently there are 1014 paid members, down from 1306 this time last year.

Craft Show Update: Lana asked if the board needed to nominate her as chairperson of the craft show, there was some discussion with Lu Wald saying not in the years she's been doing it. Lana asked what the status of Farnsworth Hall was and if she'd be able to use that for the show. The board will let her know at the May meeting. Lana said 16 applications and payments have been processed, 19 spaces reserved, 2 vendors reserved 2 tables each, 14 tables out of 22 have been reserved inside Read Hall, 3 tables out of 16 have been reserved outside of Read Hall, 2 canopy spaces out of 22 have been reserved, total amount collected to date is \$420. Advertising has started in FestivalNet. com and Craftmaster, next committee meeting is April 18.

OLD BUSINESS:

Consequential Majority Voting: Heather made a motion to move to Policy and Procedures to research for a possible change to By Law and create a policy. Joyce seconded, passed unanimously.

P&P: Pat made a motion to move to Pol-

icy and Procedures to create a policy and procedure for future Board and staff to use the @dreamlandvilla.org email address for any and all vendors and business. Dave seconded, passed unanimously.

Audit Committee: Heather stated a committee of 2 has been established and looking for another volunteer so the audit can get started. If anyone would like to volunteer their time or know of someone with accounting skills, please let Mary Sabel or the office know.

NEW BUSINESS:

Interim Director Appointment: Heather requested advice and consent of the Board to appoint Sandra Christenson as Interim Director. Sandra took the oath and was seated at the table.

Policy & Procedure: Pat motioned to approve the Administrative Policy and Procedure, Annual and Transfer Fees, Section IV, Annual Fees, B4 to add the wording "after a grace period ending on January 31 of the current year." Dave seconded, passed unanimously.

Kathie Chismar is looking to get tee shirts and hats for Dreamland and has been working with Jean Makin on a design. There was some discussion on what the official Dreamland Villa logo is.

As mentioned at the Special Meeting last week, many people will not open their door because of the solicitations and if members have a name badge or something official with Dreamland Villa, they may be more responsive.

A member mentioned we should do a reeducation campaign since many people associate the 55+ age affidavits with joining the club and the importance of returning them. Notices should be published in the Citizen and Blast and not included with the renewal of dues. More discussion on working with realtors so they are aware of Dreamland Villa's uniqueness. How the office needs to work with realtors and title companies to keep DV 55+. More problems with renters not returning the age affidavits and why can't the landlords/management companies be more responsible.

Dick McPherson read the voting results of the March 8, 2025 Special Meeting. Which have been posted on the website.




