Please call the office with any questions at 480-832-3461. Stop by to set up a payment plan or to tour the facilities.

A yearly membership fee of \$270 per person gives you access to all events, activities, and facilities in the Dreamland Villa Retirement Community. Along with your financial support, your time, talents, and energy are needed: attend board meetings and have a voice in shaping Dreamland Villa - be part of the "community."

If you pay your membership fee by January 15, 2026, we are offering a sweepstakes entry to win a \$100.00 gift card. All members who pay their fee

by this date will automatically be entered into the sweepstakes. The winner will be chosen at random and notified by email on January 20, 2026. Don't miss your chance—pay your membership fee today for an opportunity to win!

The Age Affidavit is mandated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development – Housing for Older Persons Act (HUD-HOPA) and Maricopa County to maintain Dreamland Villa's status as a 55+ age-restricted community. According to Dreamland Villa Retirement Community (DVRC) Policy and Procedures, "Each dwelling unit in Dreamland must have at least one occupant that is 55 years of age or older."

The DVRC office maintains the records required for compliance reporting, and this responsibility is supported financially by membership dues and donations designated specifically for compliance expenses. Compliance reporting ensures that Dreamland Villa maintains its 55+ community status and meets legal requirements, which helps preserve our unique neighborhood.

Dreamland Villa is what we make of it. If you are unable to become a member right now, you can still support the 55+ senior overlay by returning a donation with your age affidavit. This simple act helps ensure Dreamland Villa continues to be a welcoming place for residents aged 55 and older.

Hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving. We had what is becoming our annual Thanksgiving dinner/potluck on November 27th, in Read Hall.

This year, we have a newly formed, 55+compliance/membership and marketing committee, which will be coordinating this year's renewal season with the office staff.

I cannot emphasize enough the need for membership in DVRC. Not only does the corporation provide all of the amenities and activities that are available to a member, but DVRC is the official entity that is required to be the shepherd of the documents needed to stay a 55+ community. Your membership is what keeps the corporation open, and your neighborhood 55+. We were not just given

the 55+ status and will have it forever. It must be maintained. That is done by the keeping of the senior affidavits that are required of us to show that at least 80% of Dreamland Villa's residences are occupied by at least one resident who is 55 or older, and no one under the age of 19 resides here.

So, if the main reason you bought a home here was because it is a 55+ community, please know how important it is for you to support the corporation known as the Dreamland Villa Retirement Community Inc. LLC.

To all of you current members, we need folks willing to step up and run for the board of directors. The elections will be in February. We need at least 3 candidates this year. As of this writing, there is also a vacant position on the board that needs to be filled on an interim basis. We need someone willing to serve on the board until March 31st. Those interested may email me at president@dreamlandvilla.org or come see me in the Lapidary shop, Monday through Friday mornings from 8:00 am to 11:30 am.

Hopefully, we will get some more committees going again, but we will need folks willing to chair them and folks to be on them.

Remember, everybody, other than the small number of paid staff we have, everything else done at DVRC is done by a volunteer. The reason we only have limited hours in many of the activity rooms is due to the lack of volunteers. Please consider volunteering to be a monitor if you can, so that we might get expanded hours in some of the activity groups, as has been asked for.

Holiday Safety: Celebrating Securely This Season





Treasurer's Report: Bob stated there was a P & L loss of \$9K for October due to the replacement of an AC unit at Farnsworth Hall. Finishing out December should be close on budget. Pat commented that we're doing good considering this time last year we had to cash out two \$25K CD's to get through the end of year and currently there is \$60K in the checking account.

Office Manager Report: Pat reported for October 16 homes were listed for sale, 9 sold, 5 paid the Transfer Fee (\$400), 8 paid the Disclosure Fee (\$150), 2 sales cancelled and 8 Age Affidavits received; total income from sales were \$3200.

Craft Show Update: Lana reported \$1865 has been collected, over 70 vendors with 50 tables inside FH, 21 canopy spaces and 13 outdoor tables; 61 tables will be used. Will stop accepting applications November 19th and can always use more volunteers to help!

Maintenance Report: Rick reported the RH spa housing was replaced and the brick behind the hall was cleaned and painted. Cost to replace 4 lights on the outside of FH with LED is \$6092 and to replace all parking lot lights (13 total) with LED is \$19,799. The men's bathroom drywall was also

55+ Compliance Report: Anne Tammaro, Chairperson, stated Dreamland Villa 55+ compliance is at 79.84%, there are currently 1149 active kee card members, Ashlee Printing is handling the whole Membership Renewal process for \$3790, including postage and mailing. In February 2026, the committee plans to go door to door requesting Age Affidavits that have not been returned. In March 2026, they will send letters to landlords of rentals that have not returned Age Affidavits and advise Landlords that if they pay the dues of their renters it would be a tax deduction as a business expense. 
