
COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DINNER

President's Message

Hello everyone. Wow, it's November already, where did the Summer go? As I write this, I just conducted the first study session of the season. It was well attended, and there were some spirited discussions among the attendees on just about every item that was on the agenda. I hope to see this much member participation for the rest of the season at the study sessions. The board meetings are more formal and do not allow anywhere near as much audience input. This is your community club, and the members have a say in how it is operated. The Winter season at DVRC is starting. The Build Your Own Potato Bar was the last event for the summer, and was so popular that we had to cut off the attendance list at 100. It was a new record for an event at Read Hall.

Now that the Winter visitors are coming back, it's their turn to put on some events. We are looking forward to what they have planned.

November is the start of the annual nominations for the board season. Hopefully, by the time you

read this, we will have the nominating committee in place. There will be at least 3 openings on the board this year. If you are a member of DVRC, you are encouraged to think about running for a position on the board of directors.

We currently have 2 open seats on the board that need to be filled on an interim basis until the end of March. If you are a member of DVRC and are interested in serving for a few months, getting a feel for what it is to be a board member, please email me at president@dreamlandvilla.org.

We are going to be starting the annual membership renewal season very soon, so look for those annual payment forms to hit your mailboxes soon.

You are going to hear me say this for the rest of the renewal season and into the new year: Dreamland Villa is a federal government and Maricopa County-authorized 55+community. It is governed by the HUD Housing for Older People Act (HOPA) and the Maricopa County senior overlay. The Dreamland Villa subdivision has a 501 C7 nonprofit, private social club in which membership is available to those who reside in Dreamland Villa. The club is called the Dreamland Villa Retirement Community Inc. LLC,

or DVRC for short. As a 501 C7 the IRS dictates that we must provide activities and hobbies for its members, and has been deemed the entity responsible for maintaining the records that we have to prove to HUD and Maricopa County that we are in compliance with our 55+ senior overlay. In order to remain in compliance, at least 80% of the residences in Dreamland Villa must have a qualifying aged person residing in it. That requires us to get a senior affidavit from every single resident. So, if you are asked to, please fill one out for us. We aren't being nosy or want your personal info. It is mandated that we have one from you, the residents. DVRC also needs your continued financial support in order to keep the club alive and open. I don't wish to scare folks, but if DVRC closes its doors, there will be no other entity allowed to take over those record-keeping tasks that keep your neighborhood 55+. We will lose that status. We run off of membership revenue, and every year it goes down. Please, even if you don't use the amenities, but you moved here because of the 55+ status, we need your support, or the very reason you moved here will be lost.

Keeping Dreamland Villa Safe, Clean, and Bright

Dreamland Villa is a unique place—quiet streets, friendly neighbors, and a strong sense of pride in our community. But keeping it that way takes all of us doing our part. Here are a few important reminders to help us keep Dreamland Villa safe, clean, and well-lit.

Parking Codes

According to Maricopa County Code 10.20.030,

parking on public streets, rights-of-way, or publicly owned property is prohibited for more than 72 consecutive hours. Vehicles must also display current registration, and no one may park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant. These rules keep traffic moving smoothly and, most importantly, ensure emergency services can do their jobs when seconds count. Full details can be found at https://maricopa.municipal.codes/MCC/10.20

Junk and Debris

The Maricopa County Abatement Ordinance is designed to keep our neighborhoods safe and welcoming. That means properties should be maintained, free of junk, debris, or hazards that could create blight or health concerns. A tidy yard not only looks great but also preserves property values and keeps our neighborhood inviting for everyone.

Streetlight Outages

A working streetlight does more than guide your way home—it's a key part of neighborhood safety. If you notice a light out, take a moment to report it. Many of our lights are owned by SRP, and identifying them is simple: look for a number posted about 6-8 feet up on the pole. You can report outages online through the SRP "Report a Streetlight Outage" form, or by calling 602-236-8888 (available 24/7). Make sure to provide the exact location, including the nearest intersection and pole number if available.

By being mindful about parking, keeping properties neat, and reporting street-light outages, we can all contribute to a safer, cleaner, and brighter Dreamland Villa. Let's continue working together to make our neighborhood a place we're proud to call home!

Book Review

A Council of Dolls by Mona Susan Power

This book is historical fiction about 3 Indian girls: one in the 1960s, one in the 1930s, and one in 1900. They are actually Grandmother, daughter, and granddaughter. They each have a doll that becomes very important to them and to the story. Sissy, born in 1961, has a doll named Ethel who whispers advice and kindness, and at one point, maybe even saves Sissy's life. Lillian, born in the 1920s, was raised on the reservation, but she was sent far away to an Indian Boarding school where terrible things were happening, and her doll, Mae, finds a way to defend the girls. Cora was born in 1888, just after the genocidal Indian Wars. She is taken away from her family to be "civilized". Teachers take away her beloved buckskin doll, Winona, but Cora discovers the spirit of Winona is not lost. Later in life, Sissy changes her name to Jesse, becomes a writer, and ties it all together in a beautiful story. Made me sad at the terrible injustices we did to the American Indians, but it was a really interesting book. A quote that stuck with me is "Racism follows you wherever you go, into your future, into your soul."






