### Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet by Jamie Ford

This is a really good book, well written, moves quickly, and is actually historical fiction. It's set in Seattle just before and during World War II. The story goes back and forth between the 1940s and 1986. They lead different lives, very far apart. Henry marries Ethel; when she dies, he starts thinking about Keiko again. Actually, he never really stopped thinking about her. Will there be a happy ending, or is life in the past better left in the past?

Facing Fear: Turning Stress Into Strength

Fear is something we all know too well. It comes in many forms—from the primal jolt after watching Jaws before a night swim, to the nerve-wracking dread of public speaking or being stuck in traffic. Some fears protect us, while others only hold us back.

At its core, fear is a survival tool. The amygdala—an almond-shaped part of the brain—processes emotional data and triggers the "fight or flight" response. That instinct keeps us safe in dangerous situations. But the brain can also misfire, reacting even when no real danger exists. That's why our palms

sweat before a speech or our hearts race when we're simply running late.

Fear doesn't just live in the moment—it can grow from past trauma and imagined futures. Many of us know that feeling too well. Left unchecked, fear and stress can chip away at health, contributing to frailty, heart disease, depression, and anxiety disorders.

The good news? Fear can be managed. Experts recommend:

Reframing fears as challenges rather than threats.

Mindfulness practices such as breathing exercises, gratitude, or meditation.

Positive self-talk to rewire how we respond to stressful thoughts.

Physical activity, like mindful walking, which Harvard Medical School studies show reduces stress and improves quality of life.

We also don't need to face fear alone. Therapists, financial advisors, lawyers, or even a trusted friend can provide guidance and support. Sometimes just sharing a fear lightens its load.

Most importantly, it helps to recognize that many of our everyday fears—being late, heavy traffic, or spiders—are imagined dangers with no lasting consequences. By naming them, reframing them, and practicing presence, we regain control.

Fear may never fully disappear, but it doesn't have to control us. With mindful living, healthy choices, and open conversations, we can turn fear from an obstacle into an opportunity for growth.

So, the next time fear creeps in, take a breath, take a walk, and remind yourself: don't be scared—be empowered.






