Hello, everyone. September is here. Labor Day is on the 7th. The summer is starting to wind down, thank goodness. August certainly was humid, but the Monsoon storms were few.

We have a few events this month.

Tired of the Knock at the Door? Here's What Dreamland Villa Residents Should Know

Is anyone else getting tired of the steady stream of door-to-door solicitors? You're not alone. Many Dreamland Villa residents have noticed an increase in uninvited salespeople knocking on their doors, and knowing your rights can make all the difference.

One important fact that many residents don't realize is that Dreamland Villa is located on a Maricopa County "island." Although we are surrounded by the City of Mesa, our neighborhood is actually part of unincorporated Maricopa County. That means Mesa's municipal codes don't apply here, and any issues involving solicitors fall under Arizona state law and Maricopa County jurisdiction.

If you have concerns about solicitors, the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MCSO)—not the Mesa Police Department—is the agency to contact. Likewise, code enforcement matters are handled through Maricopa County rather than the City of Mesa.

Arizona law provides an effective way to protect your property. Under Arizona Revised Statute §13-1502, a clearly displayed "No Soliciting" or "No Trespassing" sign gives legal notice that solicitors are not welcome. If someone ignores that sign and enters your property, they may be committing criminal trespass. While Maricopa County does not require a special solicitation permit for door-to-door sales in unincorporated areas, companies making direct sales should have a valid Arizona Transaction Privilege Tax (TPT) license. Solicitors should also be able to provide company identification and contact information upon request.

The best way to discourage unwanted solicitors is to post a visible "No Soliciting" sign near your front door or driveway. If someone ignores it, calmly tell them, "This is a county island. You are trespassing, and you need to leave the property immediately." Should they refuse to leave, become aggressive, or repeatedly return, contact the MCSO non-emergency line at 602-876-1011 to report criminal trespassing.

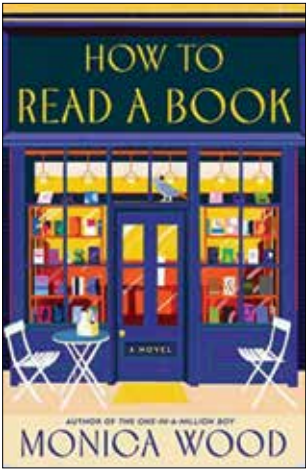
One final note: religious representatives are generally exempt from solicitation restrictions. However, they are not exempt from trespassing laws. If you ask them to leave your property, they must do so promptly. Refusing to leave or lingering after being directed to do so constitutes trespassing and may be treated as a criminal offense.

Knowing your rights—and exercising them politely but firmly—can help keep Dreamland Villa a more peaceful place for everyone.

A request from your posse: Although having your house numbers painted on your curb is a great idea, please be sure to have your house numbers displayed conspicuously on the front of your home to aid first responders in case of emergency.

Harriet gets the books at the local bookstore in the town where Violet is dropped off, and the husband of the woman Violet killed is the maintenance man at that same bookstore. Sound interesting? This all leads to a great story. It really is, and it's an easy, quick read, good for summertime.

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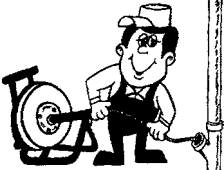


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
