

# Dreamland Villa "Where Retirement Dreams Come True"

By Littleton Bradley, Lottie King and Robert White

This volume, covering the years 1991 through 2001, has been prepared to supplement an earlier history of Dreamland Villa, a retirement community in Mesa. AZ which is located in Maricopa County. Residents are required to be at least 55 years of age. The history of the first thirty years (1961-1991) of Dreamland Villa's existence was prepared by Warren Hadley, and copies may be seen at the Dreamland Villa Library.

Dreamland Villa Community Club The First Thirty Years 1961-1991 by Warren Hadley

The purpose of this supplement is to help preserve the history of Dreamland Villa and to identify those things that make Dreamland Villa a desirable retirement community. Significant events

and factors in the community's first thirty years, as covered in that history, include the following:

- 1. The life story of the Farnsworth family.
- 2. Dreamland Villa was the name proposed by Mrs. Farnsworth (Annie), "Meet Me Tonight in Dreamland" was her favorite song.
- 3. Dreamland Villa was officially chartered by the State of Arizona on June 1, 1961, at 1:30 p.m. On May 30, 1979, an adult overlay (55 plus) was passed.
- 4. Dreamland Villa is a community of 5200 residents just minutes from the Superstition Springs Center. It is comprised of well-kept masonry-constructed homes, rental homes, and rental apartments in an area of almost four square miles. Dreamland Villa is conveniently located near most

of Arizona's cultural attractions: ASU's Gammage Auditorium, the Phoenix Civic Center, and NFL,

NBA. NHL and MLB sporting events. The freeway and Arizona's newest regional shopping mall are within two miles. Arizona's beautiful Sonoran desert, its many lakes and its other attractions are also just minutes away.

Arizona is well known for it's ideal winter climate and its hot summers.

Both are well founded, but what is not well known is that Arizona's "Pine Country" is only 90 miles away,



5. Dave Morgan, an Oklahoma oil man, liked the Dreamland Villa homes. He bought 80 acres and built the Velda Rose Shopping Center and Motor Hotel. He also built what is now the Dreamland Villa golf course. Mr. Morgan's son bought the adjoining 40 acres east and north of the golf course and sold this land to people who developed Velda Rose homes. This accounts for Dreamland Villa and Velda Rose being intertwined.

6. Facilities now part of the Dreamland Villa include the clubhouse, Read Hall, at 320 North 55th Place, Farnsworth Hall, at 6159 East University, and our library, which is a former residence at 5502 East Butte at 55th Street.


7. Some comments by early residents of Dreamland Villa are represented by those of Mrs. Lippincott, a resident since 1961.

"Dreamland Villa was still a very small community when we arrived. On the west were fields of onions and canteloupes; on the north were thick orange groves; on the south of Apache Boulevard was a sprawling desert; and on the east another community called Velda Rose was being built.

We had come from different states and countries. We were farmers. teachers lawyers, business people and homemakers. We were retired, looking for a new start: for an adventure for our 'golden' years, and for an easy way of life. We had paid our dues to society through years of hard work, trials and perseverance in our chosen professions. We chose life in Dreamland Villa, a new budding community.

We adjusted to our new way of life with a variety of things: we formed our own little private clubs; we walked the neighborhoods for exercise; and we stopped and chatted with each other; (strangers one minute; friends, the next). We got acquainted



















through many clubs and activities, such as workshops, billiards and backyard picnics. We attended weddings and funerals and helped each other when the need arose."

Mrs. Lippencott further added, "Life continued in that pleasant mode for many years. Little by little. death thinned our ranks, but the old saying was never forgotten: 'new friends are good; old ones the best; new ones are grand; and old ones are memorable.' The cycle of life continues. Soon we shall all be part of that elite group of original home owners who were parenting the infant steps of this community we call our home-Dreamland Villa."

8. The rapid growth of Dreamland Villa soon gave rise to the need for recreation facilities, which later became the Dreamland Villa Community Club. It was operated by the Farnsworth Construction Company until 1972 when a board of directors was elected and a constitution and bylaws for the club were approved. The Dreamland Villa Community Club then became its own master. It was chartered by the State of Arizona. The Dreamland Villa Community club now has over a million dollars worth of member-owned community property.

ACTIONS TAKEN AT THE VARIOUS BUSI-NESS MEETINGS HAVE INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING:

- A. The Pledge of Allegiance to our United States flag always precedes each business meeting.
- B. Board meetings are held regularly, and all members are invited to attend. Those having complaints or comments are given an opportunity in an open forum to present them before the official meeting begins.
- C. In January 2001, the club approved the purchase of the Salt River Project's easement between Higley and Power Roads.
- D. In December 2000, an anonymous donation of \$25,000 was made to the club, primarily for the purchase of equipment for an exercise facility. The Billiard room in Read

Hall was modified to accommodate this new addition.

OTHER MISCELLANEOUS EVENTS AND ACTIONS WHICH TOOK PLACE DURING THE PAST FEW YEARS:

- A. A Dreamland Villa volunteer posse was organized in April 1997, to supplement the official work of the county sheriffs office. This has resulted in a significant reduction in the crime rate, and Dreamland Villa is one of the safest areas in the East Valley.
- B. In April 1999, a History and Archives section was added to the Dreamland Villa library.
- C. Entertainment programs have been presented regularly by professional entertainers and by those within the Dreamland Villa Community Club.







- L. Indoor recreational activities include card games, dances, exercise classes, pool, bingo and individual use of the club's new exercise equipment. Facilities which are also available for DVCC members include the woodworking shop, ceramic shop, art shop and others.
- M. Dreamland Villa is convenient to shopping centers, hospitals, churches, restaurants and other public facilities.
- N. Dreamland Villa is not an isolationist community but seeks to be part of the community at large. For example, when Farnsworth Hall and Read Hall are not busy with club functions, they are available to the community at large for church ser-

vices, weddings, anniversaries and other community gatherings. Local school bands and choirs are invited to perform for the club to raise money to fund special projects. Dreamland Villa has been host to Special Olympics tournaments in 2000 and 2001.

Not many residents know that Dreamland Villa once had a bus line, Farnsworth's Dreamland Villa Transit Co., and that the Victory Lutheran Church used Farnsworth Hall while its church was being built.




The following paragraphs summarize and acknowledge the actions of some DVCC individuals and organizations which have made significant contributions of benefit to the entire club.
